The National Honor Society (NHS) and National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) are the nation's premier organizations established to recognize outstanding high school students. More than just an honor roll, NHS and NJHS serve to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Character. These characteristics have been associated with membership in the organization since their beginnings in 1921.

It is a prestigious group that colleges would like to see on your college transcripts (and gives your parents bragging rights). After you are inducted, as a senior you will be expected to complete tutoring hours as well as service hours. If you completed your responsibilities, you will receive a gold tassel at your graduation.

So you must decide if the NHS is something you would like to pursue.

Service:

The student's active participation in a minimum of <u>two</u> extracurricular activities in the year prior to induction, and <u>three</u> in the year of induction determine Service Eligibility. One of the three activities **MUST** involve community service. Service includes active participation in HHS approved clubs, sports, and organizations. Active community service may be substituted for one school activity each year. The activity sponsor must verify all activities. Continued active service in three activities must be maintained by all members throughout their term in the National Honor Society.

A TOTAL MINIMUM SCORE OF 1 IN COMMUNITY SERVICE IS NECESSARY TO BE CONSIDERED.

Outstanding service through direct improvement of their community, such as tutoring children, trash clean up, reading to the blind, etc. and/or consistently participating in charitable organization.	3

Leadership:

Candidates will earn a leadership score using the following rubric. A score is given for each leadership position listed (maximum 3 positions) on the application and the scores are added together to obtain a total score.

A TOTAL MINIMUM SCORE OF 3 IN LEADERSHIP IS NECESSARY TO BE CONSIDERED.

Holds office in club, class, or activity; or Captain (Co-captain) of sports teams(s); and regularly demonstrates leadership; or has served as manager in a paid employment position that can be verified by the employer.	4
Has submitted written proof from official activity advisor of a major role in promoting/organizing a school or community activity (Blood Drive, Hawthorne Day, SEPAC Color Run) or has served in a supervisory role in a paid employment position that can be verified by the employer.	3
Has not served in a leadership role but demonstrates cooperation with leadership figures which can be substantiated in writing by an adult associated with at least 2 activities.	2
Has not served in a leadership role but demonstrates cooperation with leadership figures which can be substantiated in writing by an adult associated with at least 1 activity.	1

Character:

Character Eligibility is determined prior to the induction through faculty input, consultation with the school administration, a check of each potential member's school records including disciplinary referrals, attendance, tardiness, responsibility, and most definitively, by Faculty Council deliberation. All members are expected to adhere to the rules, regulations, and code of conduct of Hawthorne High School.

Any applicant that earns 6 points or more as outlined in the list below will not be considered for the NHS. If any student has earned points in his or her freshman year, 3 points will be removed after the students' sophomore year, as long as no other infractions have taken place during that time. If a student acquires 6 points during his or her sophomore or junior year, they may be considered for the NHS only during their senior year, as long as no other infraction has taken place.

(All NHS applicants must report and describe any character flaws they have acquired on their NHS application.)
